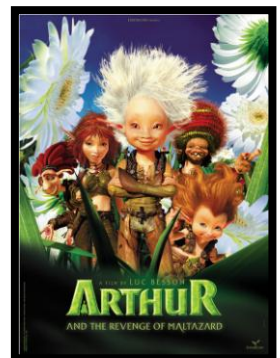

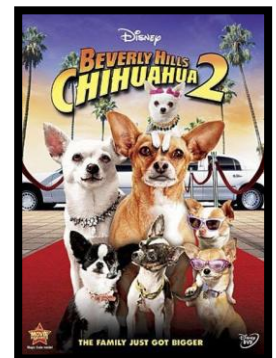


BEVERLY HILLS CHIHUAHUA 2

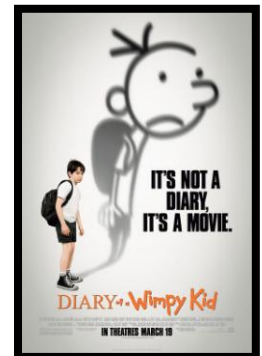

Then there's rogue Gunnar Jensen who isn't invited on trust issues. Ross has accepted a mission from the mysterious Mr Church to overthrow General Gaza, the murderous dictator of a small South American island country. During the reccie mission, Barney and Lee meet local freedom fighter Sandra, who is more than she seems. But it's rogue CIA agent James Monroe and his henchman Paine who turn out to be their deadliest enemies when things go badly wrong. **Available May 3.**

While Soren dreams of someday joining his heroes, his older brother Kludd scoffs at the notion. But Kludd's jealousy has terrible consequences - causing both owlets to fall from their treetop home and right into the talons of the Pure Ones. Now it is up to Soren to make a daring escape with the help of other brave young owls. Balthazar can't do it alone, so he recruits Dave Stutler, a seemingly average guy who demonstrates hidden potential, as his reluctant protégé. The sorcerer gives his unwilling accomplice a crash course in the art and science of magic, and together these unlikely partners work to stop the forces of darkness. It'll take all of Dave's courage to survive his training, save the city, and get the girl. **Available March 12.**

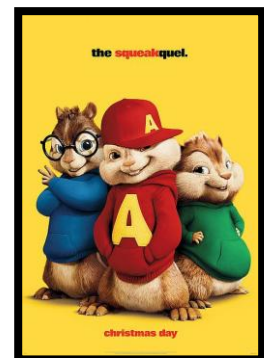


ALVIN & THE CHIPMUNKS 2: THE SQUEAKUEL

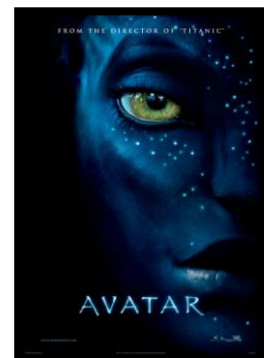


AVATAR

Science-Fiction/Drama, Rated M, 162 Minutes

Paraplegic war vet Jake Sully is sent to the exotic planet Pandora, replacing his brother who was killed. Although he's part of the military under the command of Col. Miles Quaritch, the human presence is driven by a corporation mining a unique mineral alongside a scientific probe directed by Dr Grace Augustine. Humans cannot breathe Pandoran air, so they genetically engineer human/Na'vi hybrids known as Avatars. The indigenous Na'vi are resentful - but Princess Neytiri befriends him and becomes his guide and protector on the strange planet. Jake is soon caught in the middle of the conflict between the Na'vi and the human military machine raping their world.

After the events of "Ice Age: The Meltdown", life begins to change for Manny and his friends; Scrat is still on the hunt to hold onto his beloved acorn; Manny and Ellie are expecting a baby, which leaves Manny anxious to ensure that everything is perfect for when his baby arrives; Diego is fed up with being treated like a house-cat and ponders the notion that he is becoming too laid-back; and Sid begins to wish for a family of his own, and so steals some dinosaur eggs. This leads to Sid ending up in a strange underground world where his herd must rescue him, while dodging dinosaurs and facing danger left and right, and meeting up with a one-eyed dinosaur-hunter weasel known as Buck.

Now Cobb is being offered a chance at redemption. One last job could give him his life back but only if he can accomplish the impossible - inception. Instead of the perfect heist, Cobb and his team of specialists have to pull off the reverse; their task is not to steal an idea but to plant one. If they succeed, it could be the perfect crime.

Desperate to find out which is her father, she fakes invitations from her mother to her looming island wedding to Sky. Ex-security guard from the Museum of Natural History, Larry Daley, is now a businessman in charge of his own company, selling his own inventions. When he gets a distress call from Jedediah, he infiltrates the Smithsonian Institute in order to rescue his old friends who have been shipped to the museum, destined to be put in deep storage. With the help of Amelia Earheart and a host of new historical figures brought to life, they fight Kah Mun Rah, an ancient-Egyptian pharaoh wanting to take over the world.

As Andy prepares to depart for college, Buzz, Woody and the rest of his loyal toys are troubled about their uncertain future: will they be discarded into the dumpster or put in the attic? In fact, the toys land up in a room full of untamed tots at the Sundale Daycare Centre who can't wait to break in the new toys - in a bad way. To make things worse, the Centre's toys are under the oppressive eye of Lotso, the toy bear that smells of strawberries but acts like a prison commandant. It's pandemonium as Andy's toys try to stay together, ensuring "no toy gets left behind." In the midst of the mayhem, Barbie comes face to plastic face with Ken.

Meanwhile, the Newborn Army (comprising newly turned vampires with an uncontrollable lust for blood) is coming to Forks, led by the pawn Riley. Are they a tool of Victoria in her pursuit of vengeance, or of the vampire royalty Volturi, making sure Bella follows through on her intention to become immortal? The Cullens and the wolf pack have to put aside their instinctive conflict and form an alliance to protect Bella and the community.

Childhood sweethearts Carl and Ellie never quite manage to make their dream of a house at Paradise Falls in South America come true. After Ellie's death, Carl, now 78 and retired from his balloon selling job, is being bullied by developers to sell the home they built. Adamant not to sell but forced to leave, he ties thousands of balloons to the roof, lifting the house into the air, and sets off for South America to fulfill that old promise. Carl's plan is challenged with the discovery of an accidental stowaway, young adventure seeker Russell, but even bigger surprises are in store for the duo, from extreme weather and treacherous terrain - to the strange and dangerous inhabitants of a lost world.



WALL-E

In 2700, after hundreds of years doing what he was built for, WALL-E, short for Waste Allocation Load Lifter - Earth class, discovers a new purpose in life (besides collecting knick-knacks) when a sleek life-seeking robot, EVE, is delivered to Earth by a spaceship, dispatched by the automated system aboard the Axiom - where humans have been existing in a peculiar state of robot-assisted daze for 700 years.
