In 1989, Mike O'Donnell is the star on the high school basketball court with a promising future around the corner. But he decides to throw it all in, when his girlfriend Scarlet tells him she is expecting a baby. Now, almost 20 years later, Mike has lost a promotion at work, cannot communicate with his teenage kids, and is about to get a divorce from Scarlet. Mike bunks down with his high school nerd-turned-billionaire friend Ned, but suddenly finds himself transformed to be 17 again. **Outdoor screenings available from November 17.**

BOAT THAT ROCKED. THE

Comedy, Rated M, 135 Minutes

Starring: Tom Sturridge, Bill Nighy, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Kenneth Branagh

In 1966, recently expelled from school, Carl has been sent by his mother to find some direction in life by spending time with his godfather Quentin, who runs Radio Rock, a pirate radio station outside British waters in the North Sea. Carl, who has never learnt the identity of his father, is thrown among the oddball deejays, led by The Count, who broadcast daily to some 25 million listeners in Britain. As Carl and the music loving disc jockeys get their kicks and live a life of rock n' roll, the Government tries to shut down what they see as a moral attack on English society. Minister Darmody makes it his personal mission to kill off Radio Rock and all who sail and rock in her. **Outdoor screenings available from October 26.**

BOTTLE SHOCK

Starring: Bill Pullman, Chris Pine, Alan Rickman

Perfectionist Jim Barrett and his free-spirited son Bo share a dream of producing a great Chardonnay at the Chateau Montelena vineyard Jim founded in Calistoga, California, in the early 1970s. Over in Paris, Steven Spurrier, a British expatriate who runs a wine boutique, seizes on an idea to hold a blind tasting of French and Californian wines - and goes to Napa Valley to source entries. Barrett, put off by Spurrier's snobbish attitude, refuses to participate in the contest. Meanwhile, Bo is plunged into soul-searching after beautiful intern Sam spurns his advances in favour of his best friend, budding vintner Gustavo. Against his father's wishes, Bo enters Montelena in the contest. The rest is in the hands - or rather the palates - of the judges. **Outdoor screenings available from December 1.**

CORALINE

After her family moves from Michigan to Oregon, 11 year old Coraline Jones is befriended by a local boy close to her age, Wybie Lovat. After visiting her older neighbours, eccentric British actresses Miss Spink and Forcible as well as the even more eccentric Russian Mr. Bobinsky, Coraline seriously doubts that her new home can provide anything truly intriguing to her. Until she walks through a secret door in her new home and discovers an alternate version of her life. On the surface, this parallel reality is eerily similar to her real life - only much better. But this wondrously off-kilter, fantastical adventure turns dangerous, when her counterfeit other mother tries to keep her forever. **Outdoor screenings available from February 9.**

Celebrity photographer Connor Mead is a committed bachelor with a no-strings policy. He is the polar opposite of his brother Paul who is about to be married. On the eve of the big event when the house is full of well wishers - including Connor's childhood friend Jenny, he gets a wake-up call. It comes from the ghost of his late Uncle Wayne, the hard-partying, legendary ladies man upon whose exploits Connor has modelled his lifestyle. 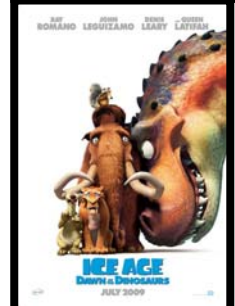


ICE AGE 3: DAWN OF THE DINOSAURS

Sucked alongside him are crack-smart research assistant Holly and redneck survivalist Will. Chased by T. Rex and stalked by painfully slow reptiles known as Sleestaks, Marshall, Will and Holly must rely on their only ally - a primate called Chaka - to navigate out of the hybrid dimension. A tragic incident in Logan's childhood reveals his superhuman capability as a mutant, like his half-brother Victor. The brothers become soldiers in conflicts around the world, but when they team up with a band of mercenaries under General William Stryker, an atrocity turns Logan from the group, while Stryker continues his quest to develop a super-mutant. Logan then retires to a normal, lumberjack life with his girlfriend Kayla Silverfox. When Victor kills Kayla as part of Stryker's plan to get Logan, he sets out to kill Victor in revenge, but Stryker manages to persuade him to undergo an experiment to make him a virtually indestructible weapon for Stryker's Team X. **Outdoor screenings available from December 14.**

Suspicious of her husband's stalling with the sale of their last asset, Faraway Downs in Australia, Lady Sarah Ashley sets out from England to take matters into her own hands. She is met in Darwin by The Drover. After an unexpected turn of events, a part-Aboriginal child, Nullah, makes his way into Sarah's life. Nullah reveals that the ruthless station manager, Neil Fletcher, is plotting with cattle baron King Carney to take over Sarah's land. To save Faraway Downs, Sarah must join forces with The Drover to drive 1500 head of cattle across northern Australia to Darwin and sell the cattle to the army. They are joined by a misfit band from the station and a mysterious Aboriginal magic man, King George.

But when the bedtime stories he tells the children begin to come true, Skeeter starts to believe he has a chance to change his destiny and replace Kendall as hotel General Manager and future husband to Barry's spoilt daughter Violet.

BOLT

Super-dog Bolt is used to danger and adventure as he protects his beloved owner Penny from evil. But little does he know that his super-powers are only a fantasy and that he is the star of a Hollywood hit TV show. When he is accidentally shipped to New York in a packing case, he embarks on the greatest adventure of his life - in the real world. He believes all his superpowers are real, until he finds himself powerless and with only two unlikely travelling companions - a cynical, abandoned housecat, Mr Mittens, and a TV-obsessed hamster in a plastic ball, Rhino. CURIOUS CASE OF BENJAMIN BUTTON

"I was born under unusual circumstances." And so begins "The Curious Case of Benjamin Button," adapted from the 1920s story by F. Scott Fitzgerald about a man who is born in his eighties and ages backwards – as he gets older his body gets physically younger. He is a man, like any of us, who is unable to stop time. We follow his story set in New Orleans from the end of World War I in 1918, into the 21st century, following his journey that is as unusual as any man's life can be.

INKHEART

Family/Adventure, Rated PG, 106 Minutes
Starring: Brendan Fraser, Eliza Hope Bennett, Andy Serkis

Meggie is a 12 year old whose father Mo has a secret ability to bring characters from books alive when he reads aloud. An accidental transfer has resulted in Meggie's mother Resa being caught inside a book's fantasy. When a power-hungry villain Capricorn from a rare children's fable kidnaps Meggie's father to bring others out of the confines of fiction to empower himself, she and a disparate group of friends, both real and magic, embark on the kind of adventure she has only read about to save him and hopefully find her mother.

JOURNEY TO THE CENTER OF THE EARTH

Adventure/Family, Rated PG, 92 Minutes

When scientist Professor Trevor Anderson agrees to look after his nephew Sean for 10 days, he also discovers similarities in the earth's shifting tectonic plates to the circumstances at the time of the disappearance of his scientist brother Max. He sets off to check his electronic probe in Iceland, with Sean in tow. They meet up with local guide Hannah, whose father ran the volcano research institute near Reykjavik, who agrees to guide them to the possible source of the volcanic activity. But they discover a fantastic and dangerous world of strange animals and plants in the centre of the earth.

MAMMA MIA!

Comedy/Musical, Rated PG, 103 Minutes

Donna runs a tiny B&B on a small Greek island with her 20-year-old daughter Sophie - the island on which she had three romantic encounters 20 years earlier, none of which ended up with marriage, but one of which ended up with Sophie. When Sophie finds her mum's tell-all diary of those days, she finds the details of three men: Sam Carmichael, Harry Bright and Bill. Desperate to find out which is her father, she fakes invitations from her mother to her looming island wedding to Sky. When the three men arrive, the dynamics of the relationships are radically changed, as are many lives. **Due to legal issues, the Singalong version of Mamma Mia! is not available for outdoor screenings.**

TALE OF DESPERAUX

Once upon a time in the faraway kingdom of Dor, a terrible accident caused by an adventurous rat Roscuro, leaves the king broken-hearted, the princess Pea filled with longing, and the townsfolk despondent. Until Despereaux Tilling, a brave and virtuous mouse with oversized ears, comes along. When banished from his home for not following the rules that society expects of a mouse, Despereaux befriends fellow outcast Roscuro and begins his noble quest to rescue Pea.

WALL-E

Animated/Family, Rated G, 98 Minutes

In 2700, after hundreds of years doing what he was built for, WALL-E, short for Waste Allocation Load Lifter - Earth class, discovers a new purpose in life (besides collecting knick-knacks) when a sleek life-seeking robot, EVE, is delivered to Earth by a spaceship, dispatched by the automated system aboard the Axiom - where humans have been existing in a peculiar state of robot-assisted daze for 700 years. EVE comes to realize that WALL-E has inadvertently stumbled upon the key to the planet's future, and is sent back to space to report her findings to the mother ship - to advise that it is safe to return home. Meanwhile, WALL-E chases EVE across the galaxy.
